Anthropology in Heidelberg is located at three different institutes: the Institute of Anthropology, the Department of Anthropology at the South Asia Institute and the Chair for Visual and Media Anthropology at the Karl Jaspers Centre for Advanced Transcultural Studies. The geographical areas of expertise of staff at the Institute of Anthropology are Southeast Asia, South Asia and Oceania. Students of anthropology in Heidelberg are encouraged to complement their regional expertise with language skills. The Institute of Anthropology therefore offers on a regular basis courses in Bahasa Indonesia, Thai and Tok Pisin. Through existing partnerships and research contacts, we are able to offer students supervised internships in a broad range of countries and organizations as well as academic exchange programmes.

THE ERASMUS PROGRAMME

With ERASMUS, anthropology students have the opportunity to study between 3 and 12 months at a partner university in Europe. Exchange students do not have to pay tuition fees and receive a monthly allowance.

For BA students it is recommended to take part in the ERASMUS exchange program in their third or/and fourth semester of study and MA students in their second or third semester.
